

Who are we?

Depaul International is the parent charity of the Depaul Group, a group of charities that works across the world with a mission to end homelessness and change the lives of those affected by it. Last year, we supported 22,000 individuals through our services in the UK, Ireland, Slovakia, Ukraine, Croatia, France and the USA. We offer diverse services to meet various individuals' needs at whatever stage they may be in the journey to a life independent of homelessness. Our projects range from emergency shelter, long-term housing, specialised programmes such as our innovative prisons project, and psychological, medical and legal support. We also work closely with our two partner organisations, the Institute of Global Homelessness, which is a Chicago-based think tank that focuses on research and policy, and the Famvin Homeless Alliance, a Vincentian Family initiative that supports established and emerging homelessness projects across the globe.

What will you be doing?

The Intern will have the opportunity to gain a variety of experience working in campaign development and communications in the international development sector. Through an intensive placement with the small team at Depaul International's head office, the Intern will:

- Help our partner organisation, the Famvin Homeless Alliance (FHA), reach its goal of welcoming homelessness projects in 90 countries to the 13 Houses Campaign
- Undertake research to identify Vincentian networks around the world that the FHA can connect with
- Make recommendations to senior members of the FHA team as to how they should reach out to these networks and support in establishing these new relationships.
- Provide communications support for the FHA's multi-lingual social media channels and website

The Intern will also be expected to be flexible and provide ad-hoc support, as and when tasks arise.

What are we looking for?

- A high level of written English
- A proven ability to conduct independent research (e.g. academic work)
- A commitment to working for marginalised people (e.g. volunteering or other charity work)
- A diligent and ambitious work ethic
- A keen attention to detail and a creative thinker
- Respect for the values and ethos of Depaul International (see below)
- Desirable: proficiency in French and Spanish.

What will you gain from the role?

We offer interns tailored personal development opportunities, which includes weekly one-to-one evaluations. We also provide an initial induction to Depaul International with the Group CEO. Interns are fully integrated as vital members of the team and will participate in our weekly team meetings.

Some previous interns have travelled internationally as part of the scheme. Travel is not guaranteed, however, and will only occur when appropriate for the work and is subject to coronavirus travel restrictions. Some interns have also gone on to be offered employment at Depaul International.

Eligibility and practical information

The internship is open to **penultimate-** and **final-year** undergraduate students. We accept up to **3 interns** a year. The scheme lasts for **six weeks** over the summer, and you must fully commit to the entire period. We are flexible about the start date.

The internship is based at Depaul International's central office in Victoria, London, subject to workfrom-home government guidelines. We are also open to offering **remote internships** to candidates based outside of London, even if office-working is once again safe.

At Depaul, we are committed to hiring diversely and inclusively so we are especially excited to hear from **BAME candidates** and those with **lived experience of social disadvantage**.

The internship is unpaid. Depaul International offers reasonable travel and lunch expenses.

Our Vincentian values

Depaul began in the UK in 1989 in response to the needs of the growing numbers of homeless young people on the streets of London. Our values are inspired by St Vincent de Paul and are at the heart of what we do. They focus on:

- A belief in the potential of people
- A commitment to rights and responsibilities
- A focus on putting our words into action
- Taking a wider role in civil society
